

VETLANDA BK – VETLANDA (UTC +2)



Vetlanda BK was formed in 1945 and the club played its first match in the highest series season 1960-1961. The club then played 43 seasons in the highest series and played 7 Swedish finals and won 3. The most recent championship title in 1992.

VETLANDA

Vetlanda has a history as a market and parliamentary place since the 11th century. According to Gothicist Petter Rudebeck, the city had a longer history than that, though under the name Vitala. The modern Vetlanda originated in a number of larger farms, whose names remain in central Vetlanda. Vetlanda is an old "wood industry town". Today, the city's business sector is dominated by Sapa, which has over 1 000 employees, as well as Elite windows (formerly Myresjöfönster).

Population

27 515 people live in Vetlanda municipality.

Arena

Hydro Arena inaugurated in September 2011. Audience capacity 250 seated and 1 750 standings. In November 1-3, the World Cup for Girls 17 will be played in Hydro Arena.

Vetlanda played in the qualifying round to go to Swedish play offs. But Vetlanda lost against Motala. Motala won both 2 games.
